1. Participants will be assigned a numbered golf ball(s) based on their ticket number.

2. On Wednesday May 26, 2010 right before the shot gun start at 12:30pm, the golf balls will be placed randomly in a container and will be dropped from the fire truck ladder onto an area containing a golf hole and pin. The participant whose numbered golf ball lands in, or closest to the hole will win.

3. If no ball lands in the hole, then the ball landing closest to the flag will be the winner. The ball closest to the flag will be determined by measuring in a straight line from the flag stick to the ball. If two or more balls land equal distances from the flag, those balls will be placed into a bag and one ball will be randomly drawn from the bag by a contest official to determine a winner.

4. Participants need not be present to win. Winners will be announced immediately upon completion of contest and will be notified by contact information supplied on the contest ticket. Contest results will also be posted in the Chamber newsletter and on the website. If a winner cannot be located or fails to claim his or her prize within ninety (90) days after notification, the prize will be forfeited and awarded to an alternate winner.

6. If for some unforeseen event (i.e. adverse weather or a fire emergency) occurs that prevents the Golf Ball Drop event from taking place as outlined above, and the event cannot be rescheduled, winners will be determined by random drawing. One number will be drawn.

Senator Noland addressed the following areas of interest and support on April 12 when he was the guest speaker at the Chamber's Government Relations committee meeting:

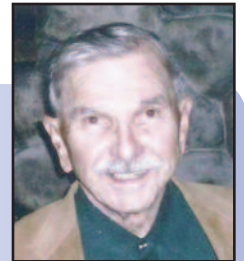
- Chief sponsor of \$18 million for engineering and 300 jobs for lifesaving access to St. Alexis Hospital at the I-90 interchange and Barrington Road.
- Supports a number of tax credit bills, SB3662 High Impact Areas Jobs Tax Credit), SB3702 (Microloans and Business Plans for the Unemployed - Still in the House), SB489 (Venture Capital Tax Credit) and SB1578 (Small Business Job Creation Tax Credit) The Ill Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity will administer this tax credit. To receive a copy of the letter of support of the Small Business Job Creation Tax Credit by Senator Noland please contact the Chamber Office.

Some of the items that Senator Noland noted in his summary of the discussions were:

- Transparency – change is taking place
- Pension reform has been passed
- Increased taxes are needed to balance the budget in Illinois
- We need to reduce health care costs
- The township mechanism may need to be reviewed because it may represent overlap and waste in the government. It does serve an important function in community service and direct aid to township residents.

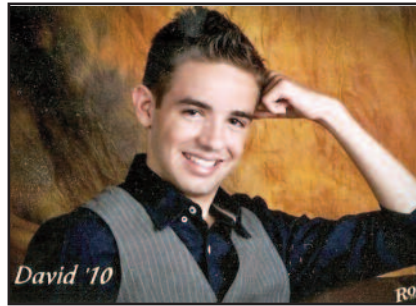
